As you come to the Lord's Supper you are affirming with each communicant that Jesus is your Lord and Savior, and that the Lutheran Church's confession of Jesus Christ and His Supper is your confession as well. ¹⁶ But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel:



I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. All:


