- ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.
- ¹³ Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.
- ¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.
- ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep.

²³ But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me. For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

²⁴Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me.

²⁵ For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

²⁶ For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what shall a man give in return for his soul?

²⁷ For the Son of Man is going to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay each person according to what he has done.

²⁸ Truly, I say to you, there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in his kingdom."


The Lord's Prayer (Please rise)

Pastor: The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen and preserve you in body and soul to life




The Benediction
