- Do I believe that Jesus Christ is personally present in communion with His body and blood to forgive my sins, as the Bible teaches?
- Do I desire and strive by the power of the Holy Spirit to live a God-pleasing life?

As you come to the Lord's Supper you are affirming with each communicant that Jesus is your Lord and Savior, and that the Lutheran Church's confession of Jesus Christ and His Supper is your confession as well. White grape juice is now available in the center of the communion tray for those who cannot partake of alcohol

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH "Bethlehem Candle"

"But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times." (Micah 5:2)

Confession and Absolution

Pastor: As we wait for and watch for Your coming, O Lord, we are aware of our sinfulness and our need

for repentance.

People: John the Baptist called the people to repent.

Pastor He knew in his heart and in his message that he himself needed grace.

People: He said that he was not even worthy to stoop down and untie the sandals on the feet of the one

to come.


We have all sinned against You in thought, word and deed. We seek Your forgiveness. We ask

Pastor:

God is our loving Father, He is our Redeemer. Jesus, the only begotten Son of God, came down from heaven and was born in Bethlehem to be our Savior. Because of His incarnation, life, death and resurrection we have forgiveness in His name. Therefore, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

People: And with thy spirit.

The Collect for The Day

Pastor: Let us pray:

People: Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to make ready the way of Your only-begotten Son, that by His coming

we may be enabled to serve You with pure minds; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord.

People: Amen. (Please be seated)

Old Testament Reading – Isaiah 40:1-11 (Isaiah speaks of, a voice that cries in the wilderness to prepare the way of the Lord. Who comes in great might to shepherd His people)

- ¹ Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.
- ²Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her

that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

- ³ A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD[[]; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.
- ⁴ Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain.
- ⁵ And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together. For the mouth of the LORD has spoken."
 - ⁶ A voice says, "Cry out." And I said, "What shall I cry?"
- "All people are like grass, and all their faithfulness is like the flowers of the field.
- ⁷The grass withers and the flowers fall, because the breath of the LORD blows on them. Surely the people are grass.
 - 8 The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever."
- ⁹You who bring good news to Zion, go up on a high mountain. You who bring good news to Jerusalem, lift up your voice with a shout, lift it up, do not be afraid; say to the towns of Judah, "Here is your God!"
- ¹⁰ See, the Sovereign LORD comes with power, and he rules with a mighty arm. See, his reward is with him, and his recompense accompanies him.
- ¹¹He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

¹ "To the angel of the church in Sardis write: These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead.

² Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God.

³ Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you.

² As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, "Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, ³ the voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'"

⁴ John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

⁵ And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey.

⁷ And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie.

8 I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

The Nicene Creed


the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
