As you come to the Lord's Supper you are affirming with each communicant that Jesus is your Lord and Savior, and that the Lutheran Church's confession of Jesus Christ and His Supper is your confession as well. White grape juice is now available in the center of the communion tray for those who cannot partake of alcohol

LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH "Angels Candle"

As the Season of Advent starts we look to the promise given by the prophets who long ago foretold of the coming King. The fourth advent candle is called the angels candle and it is blue like the first two.

In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. (Luke 1:26)

Please note that in the hymnal whenever we see a small triangle next to a hymn verse, that triangle means the Trinity is proclaimed in that verse and we are to stand for that verse.



Pastor: Last week we were called to be joyful always.

People: Yet we become cynical in many ways. We are cynical of others, our government, and the church. We confess our cynicism and the times when we have sat, doing nothing when we should have acted.

Pastor: This week we hear of the impossible happening. We often limit our horizons to what we know we ourselves can do. Mary asked this when she said, "How will this be?"


People: We ask the same question when we face what seems to be impossible, like death.

Pastor: Help us in every situation to live by faith. Help us to understand that nothing is impossible for You.

People: Lord, remind us to look to Jesus and trust in Him. For He is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Lord, we confess our sins and the walls we construct between us. (silent confession)

Pastor:

For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility. (Ephesians 2: 14) The mercy of Jesus has destroyed the wall between us and our Lord. By the grace of the cross your sins are forgiven. In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen

Old Testament Reading - 2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16

(God promises David's Kingdom will last forever)

¹ After the king was settled in his palace and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him, ² he said to Nathan the prophet, "Here I am, living in a house of cedar, while the ark of God remains in a tent."

- ³ Nathan replied to the king, "Whatever you have in mind, go ahead and do it, for the LORD is with you."
- ⁴ But that night the word of the LORD came to Nathan, saying:
- ⁵ "Go and tell my servant David, 'This is what the LORD says: Are you the one to build me a house to dwell in?
- ⁶I have not dwelt in a house from the day I brought the Israelites up out of Egypt to this day. I have been moving from place to place with a tent as my dwelling.
- ⁷Wherever I have moved with all the Israelites, did I ever say to any of their rulers whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?"'
- ⁸ "Now then, tell my servant David, 'This is what the LORD Almighty says: I took you from the pasture, from tending the flock, and appointed you ruler over my people Israel.
- ⁹ I have been with you wherever you have gone, and I have cut off all your enemies from before you. Now I will make your name great, like the names of the greatest men on earth.
- ¹⁰ And I will provide a place for my people Israel and will plant them so that they can have a home of their own and no longer be disturbed. Wicked people will not oppress them anymore, as they did at the beginning ¹¹ and have done ever since the time I appointed leaders over my people Israel. I will also give you rest from all your enemies.

¹⁶ Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me; your throne will be established forever.'"

The Gospel

Pastor: The Holy Gospel is written in the 1st chapter of St. Luke beginning at the 26th verse.

(The angel Gabriel speaks to Mary)

People: Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary.

- ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!"
- ²⁹ But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be.
- ³⁰ And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.
- ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus.
- ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."
 - ³⁴And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"
- ³⁵ And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy—the Son of God.
- ³⁶ And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren.
- ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸ And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

Pastor: This is the Gospel of our Lord.

People: Praise be to Thee, O Christ.

The Apostles Creed

All: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.


